The Committee on Port Safety & Security (C.O.P.S.S) has unified four Harbor area Neighborhood Councils and concerned community organizations with a single mission to ensure the safety of those who live and work in or near the Ports of Los Angeles.
The Committee's goals are to: Research what has been done, what is being done, and what needs to be done to secure the Ports and safeguard the community; assist in the dissemination of this information to Harbor Area Stakeholders; promote accountability for safety and security among Port Management, City, County, State and Federal governmental bodies; create a sense of urgency by all concerned that this issue is a high priority to all Harbor Area Stakeholders

Presentation Topics:

- There are 55 police and this number may nearly double next fiscal year.
- There is 43 miles of waterfront properties.
- Role: Safety Inspections and Law Enforcement
- Tasks: Enforce Navigation/Traffic laws
- Tools: Use K-9 dogs, video cameras, boats, radios, dive teams, cars, random searches, including hull and pier inspections, customs
 - screens 100% of cargo containers and opens about 5% of them,
 - there are 7 locations for cargo truck inspections, etc.
- Needs: To increase the percentage of boat patrols
- Radio Communication: LA police and LA Port Police can talk on the
 - same network and can be patched to the LA Sheriff's police.
 - Each law enforcement entity in the LA area will receive a new
 - police car with state of the art communication equipment.
- Linkages: Port Police work with the Marine Exchange Center and police
 - also interact with 80 different agencies. A joint emergency
 - command center is being set up between the LA Port Police and
 - the Long Beach Port Police.
 - Special Events: The Port will be hosting the Navy's 3rd fleet from Texas which will be in Port on May 24th...this ship is

equipped with sophisticated equipment.

How Can This Committee Help The Port & LA Police?

- Help Develop and Market Educational brochures, public forums, etc.
 - Get information on local websites
 - Do periodic mailings to all community stakeholders
 - Conduct exciting public events to involve citizens
 - Hold Internet radio shows
 - Get appealing articles in the newspapers
 - Use refrigerator magnets with the most vital info
 - Develop Block captains
 - Get info into Neighborhood Council and Home Owner Association
